# September 2016 Walk

At our February meeting, it was voted that we not have a local regular event (breakfast or winery walk) in September this year. Instead, the Oschners (our point of contacts for the year round in Ogallala) are hosting an event there during Ogallala's Indian Summer Rendezvous. Highlights of this event will be a breakfast, quilt show, car and bike show, farmer's market, art exhibit and lots of food. The event will be on Saturday, Sept. 24.

"For a brief, exciting decade in the history of the west, the tiny town of Ogallala was the Mecca for the trail herds of longhorn cattle, "choused" out of the Texas brush country and pointed north on the long drives. And by the time the glory days of the cattle drives had passed, Ogallala had more than earned her reputation as Nebraska's "Cowboy Capital" and the "Gomorrah of the Plains."

The walk will include at least twelve AVA Special Programs and includes Front Street, Mansion on the Hill, the Petrified Wood Gallery, and a climb to the top of Boot Hill if you are "up" for it. You can also take time to enjoy Rendezvous activities such as the Quilt Show, Car Show, and some of the free entertainment happening under the roof of the Rendezvous Square Pavilion. There are also many choices for food and beverage as well.

There are several choices for getting to this event. You can drive yourself and spend time, maybe even doing the year rounds at Ogallala, Sidney and North Platte. You can car pool. There are options for carpooling for one night or two nights. If we have enough interest, we can rent a 12 passenger van for about \$300 and split the cost. Butch and I will need to do the two night option as Butch will need to stay at the start/finish throughout the event, but would be delighted if anyone would want to ride along.

Right now, hotels are still pretty reasonable and have room for us. Prices are \$80-\$100 per night. If you wait to make reservations, the price may go up and number of rooms available may go down.

Jim and Cathy have wanted to do an event out there for some time and are very excited to be hosting us. We appreciate them being the POC for the year round and are happy to have this opportunity to do something a little different.
