The Nebraska Trailblazers

The Nebraska Wander Freunde Trailblazers (NWFT) was formed in March 1979 as one of the first clubs in the American Volkssport Association (AVA). Walking is a great way to boost personal fitness, circulation, mental acuity and to get outdoors. Our walks are noncompetitive and are designed to be fun. "Traditional" walks are held monthly from March through June and September through December with other club activities scheduled during the summer months. The Trailblazers currently host 9 different year-round events (YRE) along the Interstate-80 corridor and in the greater Omaha metropolitan area, including western Iowa.

Club Meetings

The Trailblazers meet at Maple Ridge Retirement Community, 3525 N 167th Cir, Omaha NE. Meetings are held the first Monday of the month except January, April (Location TBA), July and August. If the first Monday is a holiday, we then meet on the 2nd Monday of the month. The meetings are open to the public. We have a business meeting followed by a short program. Then it's time for coffee, treats and fellowship!

General Event Information

Volkssporting started in Germany and simply defined, is a personal fitness sports and recreation program offering noncompetitive walks, hikes, bike rides, swims, and in some regions cross-country skiing. You may choose your time to start within the start/finish "window" and participate in the sport at your own pace. Walking—also called "volksmarching"—is the most popular of all the volkssporting activities.

All events are sanctioned by the American Volkssport Association (AVA). By registering for these events, participants accept the guidelines for AVA-sanctioned events and agree to observe the principles of good sportsmanship. Littering is not permitted. Dogs are allowed at most events but must be kept on a leash and cleaned up after. Events will take place regardless of weather conditions and there are no refunds. Water will be provided at the Start/Finish and at checkpoints.

Trail difficulty is rated 1-5 for elevation and A-E for terrain. A complete trail rating system can be found at: www.netrailblazers.club/how-to/interpret-trail-ratings

Sponsors are not liable for lost or stolen items, accidents or injuries and/or material damage at any time incurred by participants during the course of an event. Every reasonable effort will be made to make events safe, enjoyable and memorable.

All events listed in this booklet count toward IVV achievement awards. Each participant desiring credit must present an IVV record book and completed start card for credit. Official IVV record books are available at events for \$6 each. New Walker Packets are \$6.

On-site registration will be available for each event. Each participant shall obtain a start card, which remains the property of the sponsor and must be returned to the Start/Finish point.

Water will be available at the Start/Finish point but you should carry your water bottle along the trail!

Year-Round/Seasonal Events



On the following pages you will find Year Round Events (YREs). These can be walked daily, dawn to dusk, unless time is specified. **PLEASE NOTE: all our YREs & seasonal walks feature our Online Start Box** in addition to a physical start box. Cowboy Trail is Online Start Box only.

What is the Online Start Box (OSB)?

The Online Start Box provides a complete event start box, except it is through this website. You sign the waiver, register, download directions and get your stamps, all online.

Do I need to create a personal account?

Yes. All of your activity is predicated on signing the online waiver.

How do I get the event directions?

Event directions are downloaded from the Online Start Box in your personal account.

How do I pay for credit?

The Online Start Box includes a credit/debit card payment system.

What about children, friends?

All adults must have their own account. Children are managed from your own account.

How do I start?

Click "Register for event". If you have an account, you can login. If you do not have an account, then create one. There is plenty of HELP and instructions on the pages that you will need to visit.

Detailed "how-to's" can be found in each walk box.

It is recommended to start in one of the towns listed on the OSB instructions. There are a few areas to park outside of towns, but be sure you do not block farmers' access to fields or drives. There may be other special programs that are not listed depending on your start points. You may find Par for the Course and Walking with America's Veterans in some of the parks. The trail is 187 miles long and our instructions will include several starting point suggestions. The detailed location of, and driving directions to, the event starting points are downloaded from the OSB.

Chadron NE—Agate Fossil Beds National Monument

Chadron Chamber of Commerce, 706 W. 3rd St., Chadron NE or OSB April 1—September 30, 2024 \$4 Fee

Time: This walk has a remote start. You will drive approximately 65 miles to the Start Point. Hours for the Chamber of Commerce are: Memorial Day—Labor Day M-F 8:30—4:30; Sat 9—3; rest of the year: M—Th 8:30—4:30. Hours for the Agate Fossil Beds Visitor Center are: May 14—Sept 30 8—5 M-T; Oct 1—May 13 9—4 M-T.

Description: Great views of the sweeping plains and the Niobrara Valley as well as fossil dig sites. The 5k trail is paved or boardwalk leading to fossil exhibits and is stroller/wheelchair friendly. The 10K also follows a dirt trail to the Bone Cabin and along a gravel country road. Both are out & back trails on high plains mixed grass prairie. Note that this is rattlesnake country and there is little shade. Bring plenty of fluids and watch where you step.

You will drive approximately 1 mile to the walk start at the War Memorial Park. Trail is a mix of sidewalks, paved trail and grass trail.

Description: Trail is crushed rock with some paved street. The White River Trail has stunning views of tree-covered buttes and crosses the White River on former railroad bridges. It connects Crawford NE to Fort Robinson State Park, a park filled with history from the surrender of Crazy Horse, Buffalo Soldiers and a German prisoner-of-war camp during WWII. Leashed dogs are welcome on the trail. Trail may not be plowed in winter.

Distance/Trail Ratings: 5k/10k 1B

Directions: Chadron CoC: Take Hwy 20 into Chadron. The CoC will be north of highway 20 on 3rd St. You will drive 20-23 miles to the start point. Start either at Fort Robinson State Park (park fee charged) or Crawford City Park.

Gretna, NE—Chalco Hills

Description: Daily dawn to dusk. Drive 1/3 mile to walk start. The 10K route goes around Wehrspann Lake in the Chalco Hills Recreation Area. The trail is on concrete walkways. Strollers and wheelchairs may have a little difficulty. Carry water on hot days. Insect spray is recommended in summer. Trail is not cleared during winter months. Look off to the northeast from the east side of the dam and you can spot the eagle's nest and maybe the two eagles who make it home!

After registering, you will drive a short distance to the walk start.
