2025 walking season. I wanted to enlighten you all about the RiverFront in Omaha. The RiverFront is a centralized gathering place for locals, and a space for visitors too. This public park serves as a gateway between the historic Old Market and north downtown Omaha while providing a scenic pathway down to the Missouri River's shore. The RiverFront honors the area's past by preserving beloved structures, protecting storied buildings and rehabilitating aging fixtures. Between flourishing native landscaping, robust public art and recreational diversity, The RiverFront has something for everyone.

While the park land is owned by the City of Omaha, The RiverFront is privately managed by the Metropolitan Entertainment & Convention Authority (MECA). MECA is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that also operates the CHI Health Center Omaha arena and convention center and Charles Schwab Field Omaha ballpark, both located in the north downtown area. MECA oversees the everyday activation and maintenance of The RiverFront, while providing oversight of park operations and security.

With the help of local program partners. like our club The Nebraska Trailblazers, and other sponsors, The RiverFront is able to offer a wide range of free events and activities that cater to guests of all ages and abilities. Ŏur Club has been approved as a partner to help MECA with community awareness by hosting demonstrations, classes or events at The RiverFront! Check out the calendar at The RiverFront as they post our events that help advertise our walking club. On April 19. we have been asked to have a booth at their Eggcelent Adventure Easter Event where we can use our new table cover with our logo. Just wanted to let you all know how great this partnership is to our club and take the chance to attend some of their events.

about the past as we walked through historic Florence. The Historical Society welcomed us into the Mill, the Depot and the Bank, all museums with a great history. So much interesting stuff. Florence was almost named Rock Bottom due to the rocky bottom of the Missouri River, making it a good place to put a bridge. Instead, it was named for the founders adopted daughter. And the founding of the city of Florence was itself unusual in that it was able to utilize existing infrastructure left behind by the Mormon's Winter Quarters four years after they abandoned the area to move on to Utah. And I had never heard of a "Wildcat" Bank. The only Wildcat bank in Nebraska that was never robbed was the one in Florence. Even the construction of the bank was interesting to me. They ordered the vault, installed it, surrounded it with brickwork, then built the bank around it! That vault is there to stay. I love these types of stories.

Speaking of stories, check out the popup walk on Pi (π) Day. Stroll with us past the story boards starting at noon on March 14. We will start at Lewis and Clark Landing between the Luminarium and the playground. Learn all of the facts about this fascinating mathematical constant and finish off the walk with a mini pie (while supplies last).


